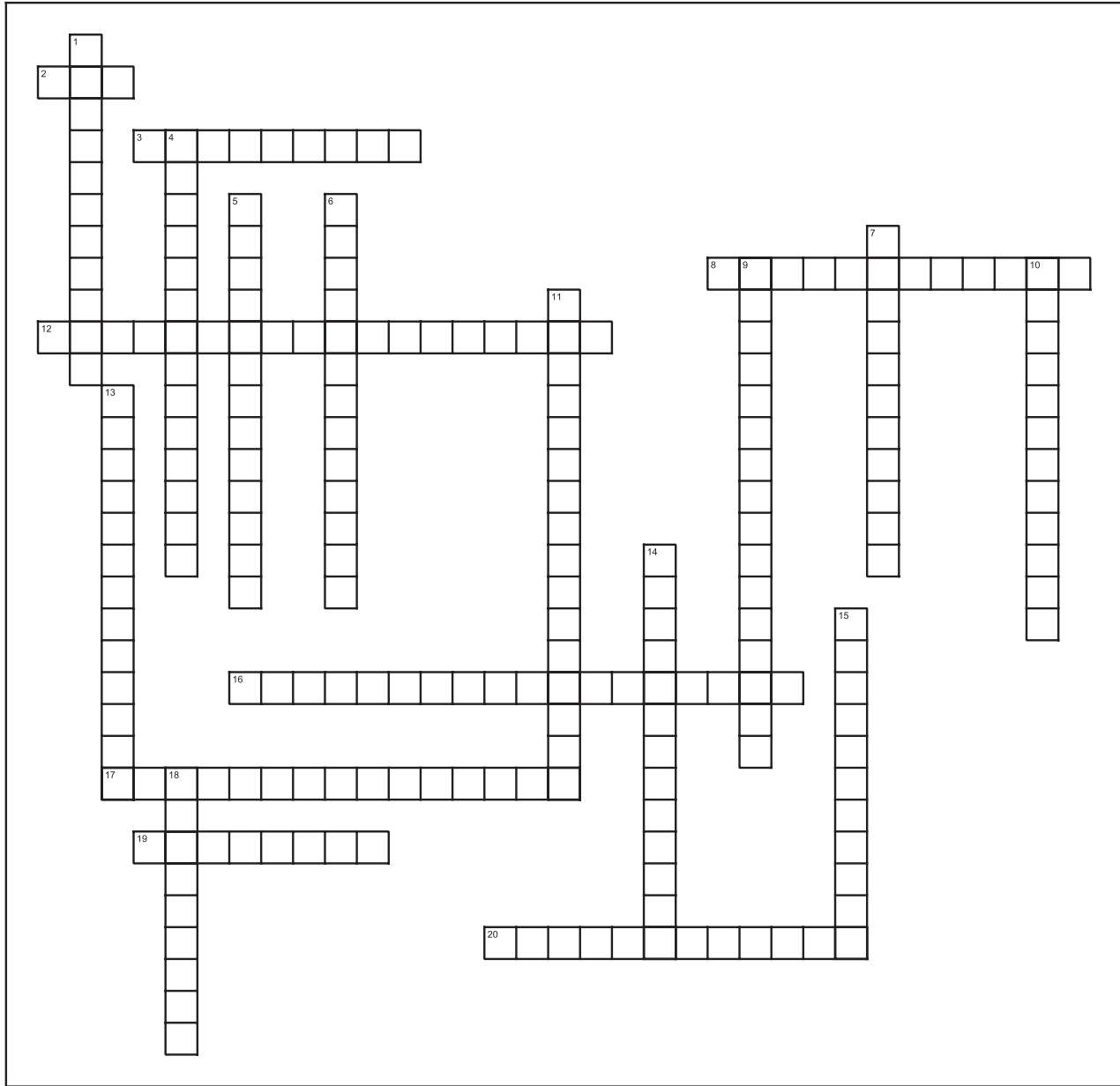


CHICAGO CROSSWORD



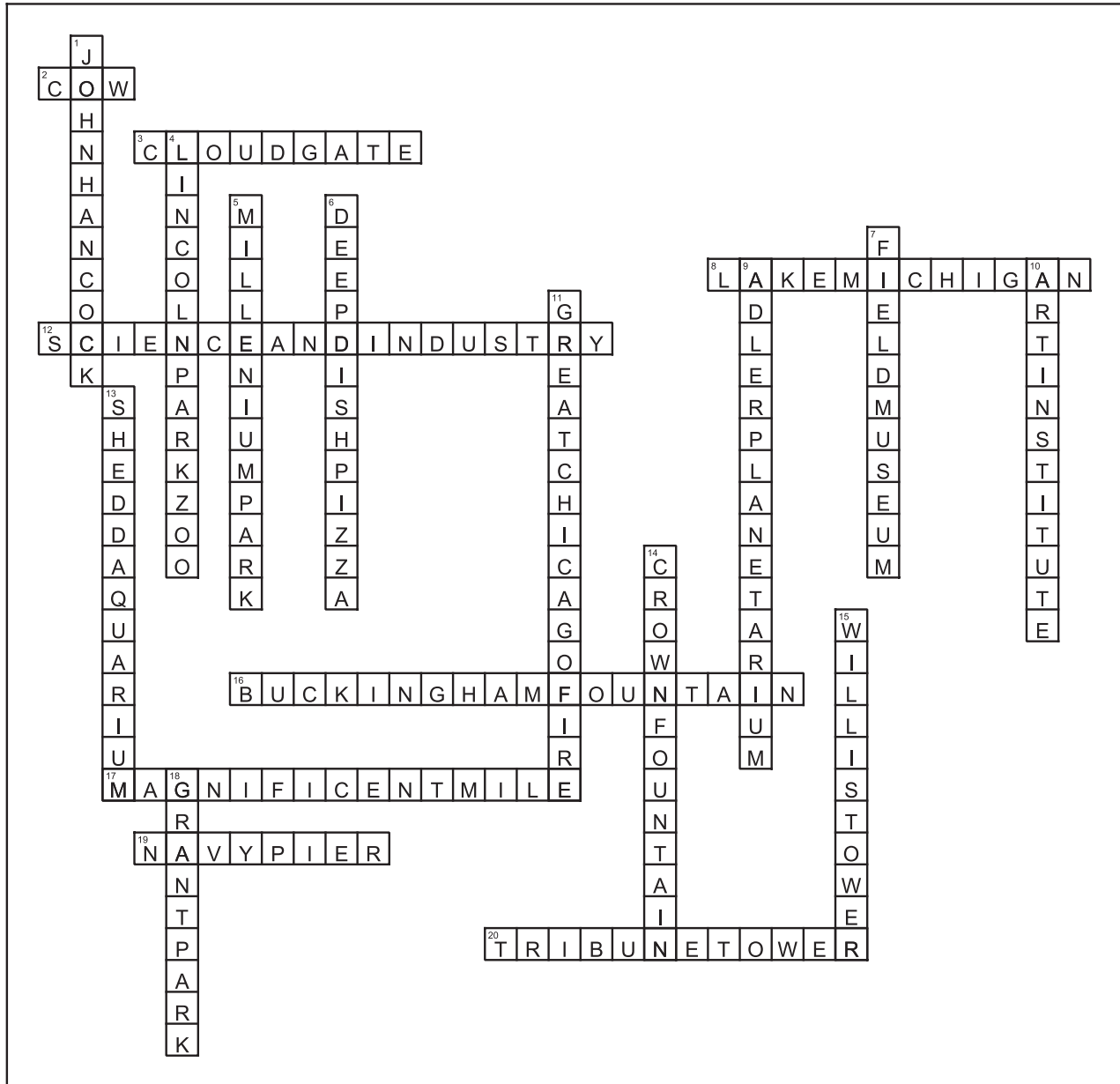
ACROSS

2. This animal is rumored to have started the fire.
3. Inspired by Liquid Mercury, this artwork is informally called "the Bean".
8. Chicago is situated on this Great Lake of North America
12. This museum has exhibits on energy, chemistry, weather, the human body, space exploration, and more.
16. This fountain shoots water 150 feet into the air and shares its name with a famous palace in England.
17. This section of Michigan Avenue north of the Chicago River has the best shopping in Chicago.
19. Here you can ride the 150-foot tall ferris wheel.
20. Rock fragments from the Alamo, Great Wall of China, and the Colosseum are incorporated into this building's structure.

DOWN

1. Go to the top of this building's observation deck for 360 degree views of Chicago.
4. This wild place is free for everyone, everyday.
5. You can find the Pritzker Pavilion and "the Bean" here.
6. This classic Chicago meal is often 3 inches thick!
7. Here you can find the largest and most complete Tyrannosaurus currently known.
9. Here you can experience the night sky over Chicago as it appeared in 1913.
10. This is both a school and a famous museum.
11. This 1871 event burned for 27 hours and destroyed 17,000 buildings.
13. Here you can meet Granddad, the oldest aquatic animal in a public aquarium in the world.
14. The towers of this fountain have video images of diverse Chicago citizens spitting out water.
15. This building is formerly known as the Sears Tower.
18. This park is often called "Chicago's Front Yard".

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
